This report describes the exiting conditions around schools within the Kaukauna Area School District. This report also includes future community improvements based on these conditions and information gathered by parents of students.

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Safe Routes to School Background Information

The East Central Wisconsin Regional Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Program focuses on engaging and empowering schools and communities to foster healthy lifestyles through environmental changes and safe walking and bicycling. By working to make it safer and more appealing for students in grades K-8 to walk and bike to school. The Regional SRTS Program is continually making strides to improve childhood health, reduce traffic congestion and pollution, and create more livable communities.

This Action Plan identifies current transportation behaviors within Kaukauna Area School District. This plan lists known walking, bicycling, and driving barriers, and it identifies potential engineering and programmatic strategies to address those barriers. This Action Plan is available for use by the city, the Kaukauna Area School District, parents, students, and community members to guide the communities work on Safe Routes to School.

Kaukauna Area School District Background Information


Kaukauna Area School District is a public school district serving approximately 4,000 students and 450 staff members from early childhood through 12th grade. There are seven schools that serve all or portions of the following communities: City of Kaukauna, Town of Kaukauna, Village of Sherwood, Town of Buchanan, Village of Harrison, Town of Holland, Town of Vandenbroek, Town of Woodville, Village of Combined Locks and Village of Little Chute. Kaukauna Area School District is located in three different counties including: Brown, Calumet, & Outagamie.

District transportation policy

Students in Kindergarten through Grade 5 are eligible for bus transportation if they live more than one mile from school; middle and high school students will be transported if they live more than two miles from school. For more information regarding Kaukauna Area School District, please refer to their District Transportation Plan.

District-Wide Parent Survey Results

All parents within Kaukauna Area School District were given an online survey to complete. There were a total of 627 responses, covering 1,153 of the 3,893 students served by Kaukauna Ares School District.

• Add fire lane on Brothers St. by the new fire hydrant.




- Contintue particpiating in Walk to School Day.

- Consider remote drop off location for parent pick up and drop off.




Enforcement:

Recommendations

Education & Encouragement:

- Educate students and parents on using crosswalks and crossings guards to cross W. Ann Street parents & students could give the staff a high five, or the students should high five the crossing guard if they are crossing without a parent.
- Consider new events/programs including: Walk to School Day and Bike to School Day.

Enforcement:

• Increase police presence on Fieldcrest Drive to monitor vehicle speeds.

Engineering:

- Add no parking signage to the north side of W. Ann Street during school hours to prevent congestion and children crossing between cars. Consider moving busses off the west side of Sullivan Avenue to create additonal parent parking.
- Insert permanent structure to separate the walking path on the east side of the parking lot.
- W. Ann Street roadway measurements include: south side of W Ann Street is 948 feet (or 47 standard parking spots), north side of W Ann Street is 725 feet (or 36 standard parking spots), and west side of Sullivan Avenue (where bussing is currently located) is 532 feet (or 26 standard parking spots).

Recommendations

Education & Encouragement:

- Continue participating in Walk to School Day and Bike to School Day.
- Consider new events/programs including: Winter Walk to School Month and the Frequent Walker Program.


Enforcement:

• Consider adding crossing guard at the intersection of Sullivan Avenue and W. Ann Street

Engineering:

- Consider adding a bus depot between Quinney/New Directions and Tanner Elementary Schools. Another option would be to move busses from west Sullivan into the parking lot of Electa Quinney.
- Add no parking signage to the north side of W. Ann Street during school hours to prevent congestion and children crossing between cars. Move busses off the west side of Sullivan Avenue to create additonal parent parking.
- W. Ann Street roadway measurements include: south side of W. Ann Street is 948 feet (or 47 standard parking spots), north side of W. Ann Street is 725 feet (or 36 standard parking spots), and west side of Sullivan Avenue (where bussing is currently located) is 532 feet (or 26 standard parking spots).

Recommendations

Education & Encouragement:

- Host a wellness event incorporting bicycle safety and the bicylce blenders.


Enforcement:


- Increase police presence to monitor vehicle speeds.

- Consider adding a crossing guard at the intersection of E 2nd Street and Crooks Avenue.


Engineering:

- Paint emergency vehicle lane in front of school entrance.
- Consider rerouting Oak Street to line up with Elm Street with stop lights. Consider installing a paved trail or sidewalk from Lawe Street to Maple Street.

Kaukauna High School

Recommendations

Education & Encouragement:

 Consider participating in the Youth Engagement Program by having high school students teach the middle school and elementary school students about safe walking and bicycling behaviors.

Enforcement:

• Consider participating in Project RADAR (Reminding All Drivers About Responsibility) to create awareness on driving behaviors in school zones.

Engineering:

- Consider expanding the CE trail east to Haas Road.
- Consider participating in the Youth Engagement Program by having high school students teach the middle school and elementary school students about safe walking and bicycling behaviors.

Future Community Improvements

- New subdivisions going in by Kwik Trip and Wildenberg around Haen School.
- The Veterans Memorial Bridge will be possibly closed in the future by Riverview Middle School. Consider improvements to traffic flow around River View Middle School when this project commences.
- The intersection of Plank Rd and HWY 55 will be getting traffic signals in 2019.
- County Rd Z in Buchanan is being rerouted and will have a 5 ft. paved shoulder all the way to Wrightstown from the end of the future CE extension (*completed fall of 2017*).
- There will be a trail into the Winchester Park Subdivision from CE (near the high school crossing at entrance).
- There will be sidewalks and urbanization to the city line on Lodebauer.
- There could be enough space for a bicycle lane if the school provides parking on site.
- Oak Street to Elm Street, consider installing traffic lights.
- The intersection of Fieldcrest Dr. and CE will be a right in and right out only intersection when the south side of CE further develops.








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




W Ann Street & Sullivan Avenue - Kaukauna WI
